Early studies of emergency preparedness of the communities near the eight chemical agent stockpile sites, including the Umatilla Chemical Depot in Hermiston, Oregon, showed the need to improve existing

emergency plans, training, equipment and facilities. The purpose of the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) is to improve the emergency response capabilities of communities that surround the chemical stockpiles. CSEPP recognizes that each community has its own particular needs for emergency preparedness. Emergency services, for the communities surrounding the Umatilla Chemical Depot, are provided by local fire and police departments; who train annually to test their response capabilities. Ensuring their safety was the impetus behind the creation of the Wi-Fi cloud and subsequent technology advances in this rural area. Wi-Fi has allowed first responders to work in the field, building confidence and safety of our first responders.
