

Schools

What is happening to the children?

- Your schools are prepared to keep kids safe.
- Some schools shelter in place indoors in over pressurized areas. Other schools evacuate students by bus. (See page 2 for specific school information.)
- They will be under the care of capable adults at all times.

Can I go pick up my children?

- Your children are safe.
- Follow the emergency instructions for the area you are in. (I.E. shelter in place or evacuate). Your child will want you to be safe.
- Attempting to pick up your child (before being advised it is safe to do so) may expose yourself, your child and other children at the school to toxic chemicals.
- You would also hamper efforts at the school to evacuate or shelter the children.

When can I pick up my children?

- Stay tuned to your Tone Alert Radio and the Emergency Alert System radio stations.
- You will be advised when and where you can pick them up.
- When you pick up your child, remember that your child can only be released to a parent or authorized person who has proper identification.

Where have my children been taken?

- If they have been evacuated, they have been taken to a host school or a special American Red Cross shelter for school students.
- Stay tuned to your radio and Tone Alert Radio for information on where and when you can pick them up.

How Over Pressurization Works

Over Pressurization (sometimes referred to as positive pressurization) keeps contaminated air outside. Here's how it works:

- Students and staff are assembled in a “safe area,” an area of the school that’s large enough to hold everyone.
- Windows and doors are closed.
- Outside air is pumped into the “safe area” through special carbon filters that remove toxic chemicals.
- Air starts to flow *out* through tiny cracks in windows, doors, walls, and ceilings in the “safe area.”
- Instead of coming *in*, the potentially contaminated air never has a chance to enter the building.
- Food and water, bathrooms, medical supplies, and materials to keep students occupied are available in the “safe areas.”
- School staff will supervise students at all times.
